



GENERAL PUBLISHING POLICIES

“The word of God is not imprisoned.” – 2 Timothy 2:9

The Cell Church general publication policies are currently as follows:

- We reproduce the original manuscript submitted by the prisoner as closely as possible, with minor editing for typos, punctuation, and occasionally sentence structure. We do not alter the meaning of the content or make changes solely for stylistic reasons.
- Although we are open to suggestions and work to accommodate the author as much as possible, The Cell Church has final authority to make decisions regarding the publication format, layout, design, and other aesthetic issues in the final publication. This allows us to maintain a consistent, recognizable appearance in our published material.
- The Cell Church sends the author a proof of the publication for review prior to printing and distribution. We ask that the author respond promptly with any corrections or revisions he or she wishes us to make.
- The Cell Church sends a reasonable number of copies of the publication to the author and anyone the author requests, provided we have the resources available at the time to do so.
- By allowing The Cell Church to publish writing, the author agrees to allow us to distribute it at our discretion to supporters of our ministry and to prisoners in various facilities, and to post it in electronic format on The Cell Church website. The author also agrees that we may use the publication as a way to spread awareness about the ministry of The Cell Church.
- The Cell Church presently does not charge a fee for copies of prisoner-written publications. However, we may choose to solicit donations on the express basis that we require financial support in order to continue producing and distributing similar publications.
- Our offer to publish a prisoner’s writing indicates that we have reviewed it and determined that it substantially aligns with our understanding of Scripture and the gospel. The Cell Church reserves the right to choose not to publish future submissions for reasons including, but not limited to, conflict with that understanding.
